the birthday of our Founder's patron saint -John the Baptist: born of Elizabeth,

itinerant preacher who knew his own mission and who humbly followed it through to the end, the one who prepared the way for Jesus the Christ.

born of Marie Augustine in the early 1800's in France

Today, along with this video introduction, the General Council has prepared a formal letter convoking the Year of the Collegial Assembly, which culminates with the 33<sup>rd</sup> General Chapter, our collegial assembly, to be held *in person* from July 24 – August 10, 2023, in Nemi, at a Divine Word Missionaries retreat center, in the foothills of Rome. The Collegial Assembly is a graced moment for all of us in the Congregation. It is not just for the chosen few who will assemble in July to formalize the fruits of

all that was shared throughout the year. For all of us, it is our life as Holy Union.

During the Enlarged General Council, the Leaders proposed ideas for the Collegial Assembly theme and logo, and entrusted the final choices to the Collegial Assembly Planning Group in consultation with the General Council. The concepts of mission, oneness, change, and movement together were the key elements to be considered.

We believe that that the theme chosen for the Collegial Assembly embodies these ideas.

"Impelled to respond anew in Mission, together we engage with the diverse changes in our world."

And how do we prepare the way for this journey before us?

By engaging and accompanying one another in this process of reflection, discernment and cross-cultural conversations

By praying with and for one another

By seeking the Light

By believing in the hope of the Paschal Mystery

The Collegial Assembly Planning Group has designed a year-long process of engagement which will be emailed to each of you on June 27<sup>th</sup>.

With our revered saints to guide us and bless our journeying together, we begin our Year of the Collegial Assembly 2023.
